George Eliot, an English writer, once said: "Delicious autumn! My very soul is wedded to it, and if I were a bird, I would fly about the Earth seeking the successive



Halloween traditions developed from Celtic beliefs in ancient Britain. The Celts believed that spirits of the dead would return to their homes on October the thirty-first, the day of the autumn feast. They built huge fires to frighten away evil spirits that night.



Now Halloween activities include trickor-treating, attending Halloween costume parties, carving pumpkins into jack -o'-lanterns, lighting bonfires, apple bobbing, divination games, playing pranks, visiting haunted attractions, telling scary stories, as well as watching horror films.

Historians say many of Halloween traditions of today developed from those of ancient times. They say that wearing a mask to hide a person's face is similar to the way ancient villagers covered their faces to make evil spirits go away.

On Halloween night, children put on masks and other clothing. They go from

home to home shouting "Trick or treat"! If the people in the homes do not give them a treat, the children may play a trick on them.



Some adults put on costumes and attend Halloween parties. They also decorate their homes. They might clean out the insides of pumpkins and cut funny faces on the surface. Then, they place a burning candle inside. Some hang fake bats, spider webs and other things around the home.

Some Christians eat vegetarian foods on this vigil day, including potato pancakes, candy apples and soul cakes. These cakes are given out to soulers (mainly consisting of children and the poor) who go from door to door during Halloween.

Mother's Day in Belarus



Motherhood is the most sacred mission on Earth. It fills you with happiness to give birth to a new life and to see that you will live on in your children and grandchildren. That's why many countries have a special holiday for Mothers to express the deepest appreciation for their work, care and love.

Mother's Day is celebrated in most countries of the world, although its date varies from country to country, depending on its origin. Belarusians celebrate the holiday dedicated to mothers on 14 October.



There was no such holiday like Mother's Day in the Soviet Union; mothers received congratulations on 8 March (International Women's Day) instead. After the dissolution of the USSR, many former Soviet Republics started to celebrate Mother's Day in addition to International Women's Day. The Day of 14 October was offi-

cially designated as Mother's Day in Belarus in 1996. The date of 14 October was chosen because it coincides with the Intercession of the Theotokos (the Protection of the Mother of God or the Veil of Our Lady) - a feast of the Mother of God celebrated in the Eastern Orthodox Church.

Although Mother's Day is a working holiday, it is widely celebrated throughout the country. Warm and sincere words are addressed to the closest person to everyone. Traditionally, on the eve of this holiday, women who gave birth and raised more than five children are awarded the Order of Mother. Special words of gratitude are said to them. As a spiritually strong and independent nation is born only in the families where parents teach their children by their example to respect the elderly, to be proud of the history and achievements of their country and to love their native land.

14 October is marked with official ceremonies aimed at recognizing the significant role mothers play in Belarusian society. Children, in their turn, congratulate their mothers on the holiday, giving them handmade gifts and cards. They want to thank their mothers and show their love to the dearest people in the world.

can get some money for it. Each time big purchases are made in my family, the older things always go to the nearest collection point.




